Local lore has it that when God finished making the world. He was still not satisfied with what He had made; the perfect creature had still not been created. He then took a colour from every being and then, brought into the world the delicately coloured the Great Western Tragopan. For the long time these birds were hunted and their meat was prized- and the feathers were used to decorate clothing that varied from brooches and adornments on caps. Their habitat was also greatly encroached upon and the oak and cedar woods which support them were bordered by villages, farm and orchards.
